



The City of Lebanon Fire Department is a career department committed to providing the highest level of public safety to our community, visitors, and neighbors. The department protects lives and property through fire suppression, emergency medical care, technical rescue, hazardous material mitigation, disaster management, fire prevention and public education.

The department covers all 14 square miles of the City of Lebanon and provides automatic and mutual aid throughout Laclede and surrounding counties.

The Lebanon Fire Department protection classification according to Insurance Services Office (ISO) is a 4. Graded on a 1-10 scale, with 1 being the best, 10 the worst, the City of Lebanon Fire Department classification places the department in the top 17% across the State of Missouri.

The department also participates in the Missouri Statewide Mutual Aid System. Through this statewide system the City of Lebanon Fire Department has deployed personnel and apparatus throughout the State of Missouri. The City of Lebanon has also benefited from mutual aid through the statewide program.

A dedicated staff of highly trained individuals working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week operating from two fire stations respond to over 1800 incidents annually. The department utilizes two engines, two ladders, a heavy rescue, brush unit, and three staff vehicles. Each of these vehicles plays an important part in protecting the lives and property of our citizens and visitors. Average response times within the City of Lebanon are 3-5 minutes.

The City of Lebanon Fire Department is active in our community as well. Public education, MDA fund raising, fire inspections, and child safety seats are only some of our community projects. Department members also serve on area boards and are members of local civic clubs.
